JOB DESCRIPTION

Trustees play a vital role in guiding the strategic direction of Queer Britain, ensuring the museum remains true to its mission, values, and charitable objectives. Trustees are responsible for governance, oversight, and advocacy, helping to build a sustainable and inclusive future for the museum.

Every trustee at Queer Britain has a designated 'zone of genius' – a specific area of expertise they bring to the Trustee Board to support governance and advice.

We are seeking three new trustees with specific zones of genius that we need to continue Queer Britain's mission to Preserve, Reclaim and Inspire LGBTQ+ History and Culture.

#### **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Ensure Queer Britain complies with its governing document, charity law, and other relevant legislation.
- Contribute actively to the board's strategic decisionmaking and policy development.
- Safeguard the financial stability and sustainability of the museum.
- Promote the museum's mission and values within and beyond the LGBTQ+ community.
- Support fundraising, partnerships, and public engagement efforts.
- Act as an ambassador for Queer Britain, representing the museum at events and in the media when appropriate.
- Be the 'Zone of Genius' for a specific area of Queer Britain's work

#### PERSON SPECIFICATION

We welcome applications from individuals who:

- Are passionate about LGBTQ+ history, culture, and rights.
- Have a commitment to equity, diversity, and inclusion.
- Bring integrity, sound judgment, and collaborative spirit.
- Are willing to devote the necessary time and effort.
- Have experience or understanding within a specific 'zone of genius'

#### TIME COMMITMENT

- Quarterly Board Meetings, usually in-person, with occasional hybrid option available
- Optional membership of subcommittee, with additional meetings necessary
- Attending Queer Britain events, acting as an ambassador

 Charity Trustees are volunteers, with travel expenses available when acting on behalf of the Museum

All staff and Board members are responsible for care of objects on display and in store, as well as care for public and operational spaces, visitors, volunteers and other team members at all times.

# MARKETING AND COMMUNICATIONS

- Proven track record in marketing, communications, or public relations.
- Ability to advise on brand development, audience engagement, and media strategy.
- Experience with digital marketing, social media campaigns, and press relations.
- Understanding of inclusive and representative messaging for LGBTQ+ audiences.

# ARTIST REPRESENTING THE COMMUNITY

- Practicing artist (any discipline) with a strong connection to LGBTQ+ identity and expression.
- Demonstrated commitment to community representation and cultural activism.
- Ability to bring creative perspectives to board discussions and museum programming.
- Willingness to advocate for artistic inclusion and support emerging LGBTQ+ creatives
- Experience in collaborative or participatory art projects.
- Engagement with intersectional LGBTQ+ communities.
