Eisenberg's Sandwich shop. 174 fifth Ave, between 22nd and 23rd. St. NY. Classic deli. Like Katz's, only more bar like.

Pastis- awesome bar restaurant in meat packing district. 9 Ninth Ave , corner Lt West 12 St. Coffee shop. great bar/rest... 29 Union Square West.

Balthazar Famous rest/bar.. classy... 80 Spring st, 'Nolita' area Go in around 10am for a late breakfast, need to book for dinner 212/9651414

Frank. Great Italian rest, little bar too, 88 Second Ave, between 5th & 6th St. East village

Katz's Deli. Famous 100+ year old Deli, awesome atmosphere, get there for lunch!! Have Pastrami on Rye!! 205 East Houston St, corner of Ludlow St. Lower East side.

The Park... groovy bar, classy joint!! 118, 10th Ave B-Bar & Grill, Bowery + 4th st. Cool Bar!

Standard Grill. 848 Washington St. Greenwich Village. Bistro menu, sit outside, good people watching spot.

Tao. Classy bar/Rest!! 42 East 58th St. Huge joint, based on Paris' Buhda bar. The Hudson hotel, classy bar, worth a visit, styling! 57th St (Upstairs for bars)

Flatiron Lounge 37th West and 19th St. Frank Sinatra used to drink here. 1920's style, classic spot.

Gintanes. Cool cafe, Nolita area, also there 'Bread' 20 Spring St. 'Lombardis' Pizza, great place, 32 Spring St.

Pheasant 194 Elizabeth St. Nolita area, Wholesome food, wood fired oven, great Pizza  
For old style American diner go to "Olympic Flame Diner" W60th St and Amsterdam Ave.

Village Yokochō Japanese, great! 8 Stuyvesant St., (9th st & 3rd Ave) Grundgy hidden Japanese Rest. very 'hip' (upstairs) Cafe Reggio. old espresso cafe, 119 McDougal St, near West 3rd St.

Live bait. Rest. 14 East 23rd St. Pangea rest/bar. 178 2nd Ave. Cool joint.

Peter Luger Steak house. Been voted best steak in NY for past 2 decades. 178 Broadway Brooklyn, N.Y. 11211 Reservations: 718-387-7400

Plaza Hotel, 5th Ave. Very posh famous hotel. check out bar, expensive but iconic spot.

For a genuine Little Italy experience, you should go to the Bronx, Arthur Ave. Really authentic NY Italian area, better than the touristy one in Manhattan.

Momofuku Noodle Bar. 171 1st Ave, east Village. Very popular joint, steamed pork buns and fried chicken the go. Could be a que.

"The soup Nazi" from Seinfeld- 56th St. b/w 7th and 8th Ave. Amazing soup, just don't say a word when ordering!

You've got to try go to Yankee stadium, Madison Sq garden and catch a game of baseball or basketball. Be sure to go to Central Station, magnificent foyer!

I enjoyed visiting Harlem, 125th St. If you can catch a show at the Apollo theatre that would be awesome. Many famous black acts started here, usually on a Friday night. Speak to your hotel for bookings.

Also get the free ferry to Stanton Island, gives glorious views of NY city and Statue of Liberty. Only a 30 or so minute ride, quick way of getting great views without wasting too much time. I also enjoyed the walk across Brooklyn Bridge.

Pauly Gees, Pizza Williamsburg. Recommended, have not tried. The Whythe hotel. Williamsburg

The Gutter. Bowling alley bar. Fun place. 200 N 14th ST. Brooklyn. 5pm-4am
